Music permeates our lives. It drifts out of department store speakers and over restaurant tables, it blares out of cars and earphones, it bounces around our celebrations, and it echoes through our religion. Music rings through our memories, connected to hundreds of people, places, and things.

But music is so much more than just a background track to our life. When we human beings make music, we connect with other people. We have an opportunity to process emotions and find expression for our thoughts. Sometimes we experience new ideas, carried on a melody, that sink deep into our heart and mind. Other times a phrase of music will open our ears, and we find new meaning in old words. We may even hear a piece that wordlessly seeps into our being, just giving us beauty.

Human history has always shown music as a basic, even necessary, piece

of our communal and individual experience. Science is now showing how true this is.

Studies repeatedly show how making music is tied to things like contentment, emotional processing, problem solving, memory, healthy brain activity, community building, and even physical health.

In our faith, we worship, reflect, and meditate using music. Our hymns and songs bring us together as we sing. We share that music both with the people standing in our pew and people the world over who share our song. We have an opportunity to experience music that heals our hearts as we grieve, and gives voice to our exultation as we celebrate. Our faith extends music to us as a means to experience God's loving presence in both joy and sadness, and as a way to find community in the love of the church.

Here at All Saints, we have a place

for you and your children to make music. Music is for all ages, for all people, for all of life. Whether you have a babbling one year old, trying to sing along to "He's Got the Whole World in His Hands," a seventh grader who wants to play handbells, or a rough and tumble 2nd grader that has never been in a choir. It is so important to give children the gift of music, not just as a spectator but also as a music maker. This next year is going to be filled with wonderful friends and beautiful music, and we want your child to be a part!
